Upcoming Presentation: Vaping, Smoking, and Yes, Eating Substances—What a Parent Should Know and Do

Join us for an upcoming presentation by Stanford University's Dr. Bonnie Halpern-Felsher. New vaping products are infiltrating the market, including new disposable ecigarettes, e-cigarettes shaped like watches and other household products, and even "non-nicotine" and cannabis vapes, as well as oral nicotine products. Adolescents and young adults are using these products more often than combustible cigarettes. This presentation will provide detailed information about these new products, including information on nicotine levels, addiction risks, health effects, and marketing of these products. The presentation will also provide information on reasons for adolescent use of these products, including flavors, appeal, marketing, perceived reduced harm, stress, anxiety, and depression, along with other misperceptions about the products. Dr. Halpern-Feisher will also provide evidence-based resources that can be used to help prevent and reduce use of these products, as well as advocacy efforts occurring in the United States to reduce use.

At the end of this presentation, parents will:

- Understand the different vaping, tobacco, and cannabis products that youth are using
- Understand the reasons why youth are using these products
- Leave with resources and tools to help identify, prevent, counsel and treat youth regarding vaping

Upcoming Workshop with Dr. Ned Hallowell: Making Your Life (with ADHD) VAST and Full of Potential

What if instead of thinking of ADHD as a deficit and a disorder, we saw it for what it really is, a way of being in the world which with the right support can be a wonderful way of being? Sponsored by SEPTA, world-renowned Drs Hallowell and Ratey will give a workshop to teach about the new term for ADHD in their latest book ADHD 2.0. It's VAST, or Variable Attention Stimulus Trait. The old term of ADHD with its emphasis on pathology and on a "deficit disorder" is inaccurate and stigmatizing. The new term is far more accurate, allowing for positive attributes, not just negative ones. Drs Hallowell and Ratey will explain the rich and complex world of VAST and how a simple change in framing can set off an entire shift in thinking and treatment.

Edward (Ned) Hallowell, M.D. is a board-certified child and adult psychiatrist and world authority on ADHD. He is also author of the best-selling book Driven to Distraction: Recognizing and Coping with Attention Deficit Disorder from Childhood Through Adulthood.
